Summary of research assignment or task

Students work in groups to complete a comprehensive report of a particular community's health status, services, and systems (CHSSS). For this assignment, students need to find access to numerous health systems and services data typically compiled through nonprofit and governmental organizations.

Students were provided a handout outlining how to navigate sources very specific to the work in this course so they could focus on the session and not on taking copious notes (attached).

Classroom Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) – at least one, no more than three
